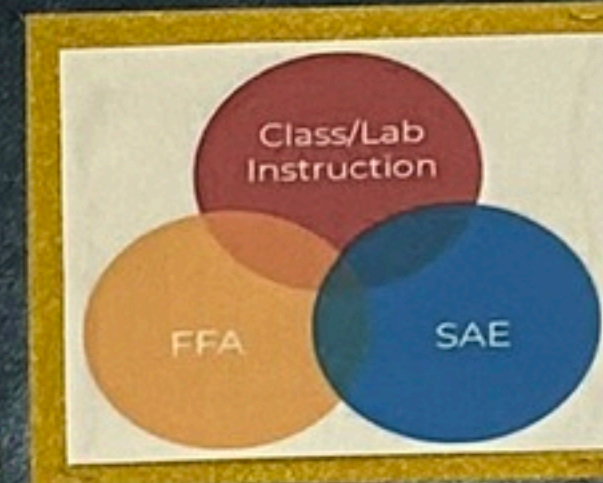

## SAE's

- Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE) involves practical agricultural activities performed by students and members outside of the scheduled classroom and laboratory time.
- 4 Types of SAE's are exploratory, entrepreneurship, placement, and research/experimentation.
- Members can raise market or breeding animals. They can raise goats, lambs, chickens, rabbits, pigs and cattle.

## CDES

- Career Development Events build on what is learned in agricultural classes and encourage members to put their knowledge into practice. These events are designed to help a member prepare for a career in agriculture by testing and challenging the student's technical, leadership, interpersonal and teamwork skills as well as their knowledge of the subject matter. CDEs answer the question, "When will I use this knowledge in the real world?"
- Many CDEs are qualifying events for the National FFA CDE competition and/or offer scholarship opportunities.

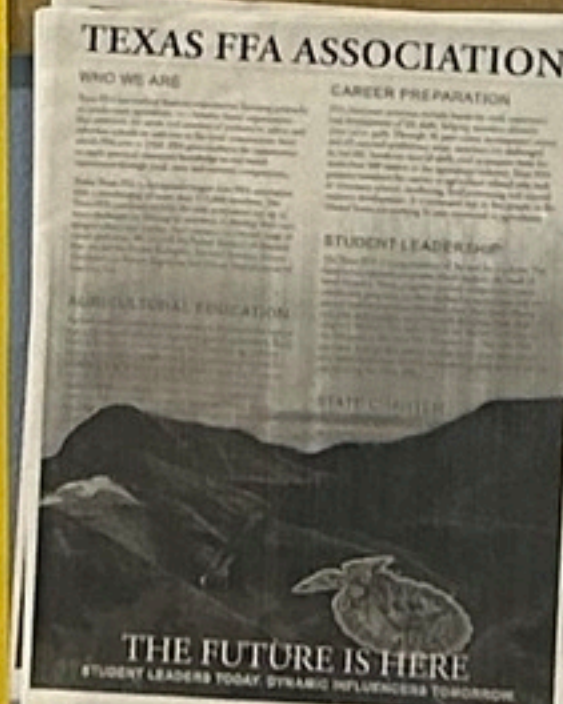

## SDES

- Speaking Development Events are designed to develop the ability of all FFA members to express themselves on a given subject. Students are encouraged to develop their communication skills and learn to formulate their thoughts for presentation to a variety of audiences.
1. Prepared Public Speaking: Students are to follow:
- Animal Science:** Participants may choose any current or future subject that deals with any aspect of the industry of dairy, swine, poultry, sheep, swine, beef, specialty animals, equine, etc.
  - Plant Science:** Participants may choose any current or future subject that deals with any aspect of horticulture and/or agronomy industries. This may include such areas as floriculture, fruit and ornamental production, nursery operations, turf and landscape management, crop production, specialty crop production, etc.
  - Natural Resources:** Participants may choose any current or future subject that deals with topics such as soil, water, air, and waste, wildlife, forestry, conservation, environmental, recycling, energy, environmental issues, etc.
  - Artificial Intelligence:** Participants may choose any current or future subject that deals with topics such as automation, robotics, artificial intelligence, machine learning, data science, etc.
  - Agribusiness:** Participants may choose any current or future subject that deals with topics such as marketing, farm management, international trade, and economic development, public, animal rights, law, subsidies, price supports, etc.
  - Agribusiness Technology and Communications:** Participants may choose any current or future subject that deals with topics such as biotechnology, genomics, bioprocessing, mechanical engineering, farm safety, use of technology, research, new, existing, companies, innovations, communication, social media, public relations, etc.

## What is the Three Component Model?

**ABBY'S THREE COMPONENT MODEL**

SAEs are a vital part of the FFA program. They provide students with hands-on experience in agriculture. Abby's model shows the integration of SAEs with classroom instruction and leadership development.

**DELANEY'S THREE COMPONENT MODEL**

Delaney's model emphasizes the importance of SAEs in providing students with practical experience. It shows how SAEs can be integrated with classroom learning and leadership activities.

**CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION**

Classroom instruction provides students with the theoretical knowledge and skills needed for success in agriculture. It includes lessons on animal science, horticulture, and ag mechanics.

**SAE**

Supervised Agricultural Experiences (SAEs) provide students with hands-on experience in agriculture. They can be performed on or off campus and are supervised by a teacher or industry professional.

**LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT**

Leadership development activities help students build the skills and confidence needed to become effective leaders. These activities include public speaking, team building, and community service.

**What is an SAE?**

SAE stands for Supervised Agricultural Experiences which include improvement projects and supplemental skill development. An SAE is a student-led, instructor supervised, work-based learning experience that helps prepare students for their future careers. SAEs have six different types which include: foundational, placement/internship, ownership/entrepreneurship, research, school-based enterprise, and service learning SAEs.
